Pride Place: Innovations in Serving Elders

OFF-SITE SESSION

Thursday, June 6th • 1:30pm • 1521 Broadway

Description: Pride Place, owned and operated by Community Roots Housing, is designed as an affirming environment for LGBTQIA+ elders. Located in Seattle's Capitol Hill neighborhood, the affordable apartments serve those aged 55+ earning between 30% - 60% of the Area Median Income. The development includes studios and one-bedrooms and features a 4,400 square foot community center on the ground floor, operated by GenPride, a nonprofit dedicated to serving LGBTQIA+ seniors. This off-site will feature approaches to serving elders, thoughtful community partnerships, and environmentally sound design.

Agenda:

- 1:30pm: Group departs Renaissance Hotel for Pride Place in Capitol Hill, arrives between 1:45-2:00pm.
- 2:00pm: CRH describes nearby development in Capitol Hill and takes the group on a tour of the building, including community space, residential units and environmental design features on the building's rooftop.
- 2:45pm: After building tour, group visits YouthCare community space for discussion and light refreshments.
- 3:30pm: Group departs back to the Renaissance Hotel. Attendees are welcome to take the coach bus or may choose to walk back on their own.
